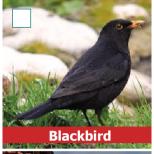
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Bird watching

This checklist shows some of the more common birds you are likely to see but there are many cheap books available with details of all the British species.

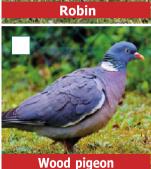


Females are less colourful in some species
